Toastmasters International District 76 to Hold All-Japan Speech Contest at Nagoya Congress Center

Nagoya, Japan, May 13, 2013

Toastmasters International District 76 is going to hold the Spring Conference from May 17 (Fri.) through 19 (Sun.) at Nagoya Congress Center. In this conference, the finals of Japanese and English speech contests will be held, where six contestants each who won the preliminary rounds among almost 140 clubs nationwide will compete. The Japanese final will be held on the afternoon of May 18, and the English final on the morning of May 19. The winner of the English final will proceed as the representative of District 76 to the 2013 Toastmasters International Convention Semi-Finals in August in Cincinnati, Ohio, U.S.



The guests of District 76 Spring Conference include Kwong Yue Yang (Guangzhou, China), a second-place winner in the World Championship of Public Speaking held in August 2011 in Las Vegas, Nevada. On the evening of May 17, Kwong is going to give us a workshop titled "Speak and Tweak," which is about a Speechcraft program. On the morning of May 19, he will give an English keynote address on what motivated him to participate in the Toastmasters International and its World Championships.





On the afternoon of May 18, we will welcome Makoto Omi, an emeritus professor at Nanzan Junior College and also known as a leading authority on interpretive reading. He will serve as a keynote speaker and give us a lecture on the methodology of nurturing people's ability to express themselves in English.
