~ DTM Interview ~ A Way to DTM, A Way from DTM ~

For many of us, [Distinguished Toastmasters \(DTMs\)](#) may appear to be people in a different world. The DTM Award is the highest achievement in the Toastmasters International education program, and many members may have already given up the award and may be even skeptical about the meaning of attaining the award. The DTM is by no means easy to accomplish, but there must be something worthy of trying hard to achieve it. We interviewed two DTMs, DTM Masahiko Inatsugi from the Speak-up and Nara Toastmasters Clubs and DTM Hiroyuki Ito from the Hibiki and Tokyo Metropolitan Toastmasters Clubs to find out how valuable the DTM can be.

The questions asked are the following three:

(1) In which part of the Communication Track and the Leadership Track did you feel most difficult? How did you overcome it?

(2) Did you find any change in yourself after obtaining the DTM Award? Did you feel that the DTM was useful for your work or everyday life?

(3) How would you answer if asked “Why should we get the DTM?”

The answers of the two DTMs are:



DTM Inatsugi

(1) I had difficulties to complete some projects of the communication track such as “The Entertaining Speaker” to be qualified to apply for ACB. It's because I'm not a good speaker of English. Thanks to my Toastmasters colleagues who were so kind to listen to my speeches, I had completed the necessary numbers of speech programs to apply for DTM Award.

(2) I'm afraid leadership isn't recognized properly in Japan. HPL Program provides Toastmasters with opportunities to learn and practice true leadership. After Toastmasters learn leadership from HPL program, they're applying their leadership skills for their activities in their workplace and community successfully. I'm one of them.

(3) Not only myself but also many Toastmasters who worked on HPL program have learned true leadership. At the end of the program I received DTM award in 2006. They shall receive the title as well.

Every Toastmaster knows Toastmasters learn both communication and leadership. Through Toastmasters activities such as being involved in Toastmasters clubs or/and the District management as officers, Toastmasters can learn and practice leadership. At my proposal, since 2005 Speak-Up Club has been carrying out an assistance project for members who are qualified to conduct HPL program. They shall be provided both meeting rooms for their guidance committee and recommended necessary number of committee members. I'm its organizer.



DTM Ito

(1) The most difficult part was the [High Performance Leadership \(HPL\) Program](#). Everything was written in English, and I had no idea what to do and how to reach the goal. But I teamed with other members who also intended to complete the HPL Program and worked very hard together. These efforts finally led to establishing a new club. Those friends are really my treasure.

(2) Achieving the DTM itself does not mean that your speech skills will improve dramatically or you will become a leader admired by everyone. But it seems to have given me some confidence although I don't have any specific reasons why I had such confidence.

(3) If you want to discover what possibilities you have, try to get the DTM. On the way to the DTM, you will probably realize what you are (and are not) good at and know more about yourself and the Toastmasters Club.

DTM Inatsugi and DTM Ito have been displaying excellent leadership and working hard for the club even after they accomplished the award, and this fact makes us realize that obtaining the DTM Award is not a goal but what's even more important is what you do thereafter. Why don't you try to achieve the DTM Award? It may lead you to expand your possibilities and discover something new about yourself.

DTM: Distinguished Toastmaster (DTM) is Toastmaster's highest member award. Those who have achieved both the Advanced Communicator Gold (ACG) in the Communication Track and the Advanced Leadership Silver (ALS) in the Leadership Track are eligible to make application with the World Headquarters. With DTM, those who have earned this highest honor is regarded as having fully completed the two tracks by going through various manuals and practicing leadership in their clubs, district, and real life.

HPL: High Performance Leadership Program is one of the requirements to receive the Advanced Leadership Silver (ALS) in the Leadership Track. The program requires you to form and lead a team for a certain selected project and thereby provides you with an opportunity to undergo hands-on training to develop leadership while working with others in the team. Your project can be anything, whether or not in the framework of the Toastmasters Club, so long as it is a worthwhile activity involving cooperation of others. You are also required to recruit a guidance committee that will meet with you at the end of each of the five stages of the program from planning through presentation of the results and provide helpful feedback.

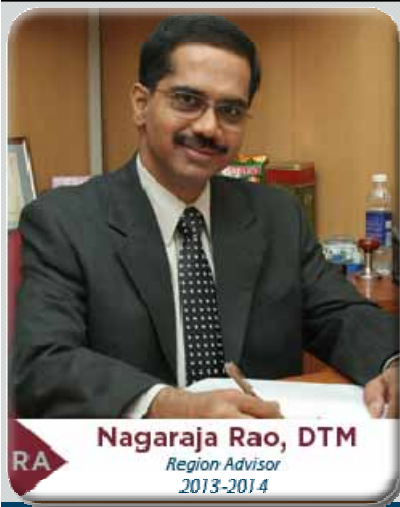

District76 Alignment Committee has been working on the re-alignment of District clubs. On January 20th, they announced 2014-2015 District76 Alignment Proposals -1st Draft to the perusal of club presidents, VPEs and District Officers. Please check the alignment policy announced on November 16th and three big re-alignments below.

Please feel free to contact your area governor for the details or sending your comments.

The alignment policy announced on November 16th

1. A mixture of Japanese & English Clubs based on geographic aspects.
2. Six (6) Divisions, with 4 to 6 clubs per area. However, it is permissible to have the number of clubs be up to be 3 or 7 depending on the particular situation of that area.
3. Based on opinions taken from the questionnaire.

Three big re-alignments

1. Current Areas 51 and 52 are combined into Area 51.
2. Future Areas 52, 53 and 54 are re-aligned, taking the train lines into consideration.
3. Two Clubs in Okinawa are a part of Area 62, taking airport location into account.

Those who have achieved both the Advanced Communicator Gold (ACG) in the Communication Track and the Advanced Leadership Silver (ALS) in the Leadership Track are eligible to make application with the World Headquarters. With DTM, those who have earned this highest honor is regarded as having fully completed the two tracks by going through various manuals and practicing leadership in their clubs, district, and real life.

HPL: High Performance Leadership Program is one of the requirements to receive the Advanced Leadership Silver (ALS) in the Leadership Track. The program requires you to form and lead a team for a certain selected project and thereby provides you with an opportunity to undergo hands-on training to develop leadership while working with others in the team. Your project can be anything, whether or not in the framework of the Toastmasters Club, so long as it is a worthwhile activity involving cooperation of others. You are also required to recruit a guidance committee that will meet with you at the end of each of the five stages of the program from planning through presentation of the results and provide helpful feedback.
